

## **SOUTH CAROLINA RECOVERING PROFESSIONAL PROGRAM SENIOR CONTRACT**

The SCRPP Senior Monitoring Program (Program) was designed to provide support and continued documentation of recovery while affording reduced testing to eligible participants. The Program also provides continued affirmation of compliance for administrative, employment, and/or credentialing needs. Program participation may be completely voluntary, Board ordered, or offered by SCRPP staff to a participant with a mild substance abuse diagnosis as provided by current Board policy. A participant participating in the Program is expected to follow the terms of his/her original SCRPP monitoring agreement subject to the following exceptions:

- 1) The annual participant fee for the Program is three times the monthly rate set forth on the SCRPP monthly fees form or ( \_\_\_\_\_ ). Payment must be received in advance on a quarterly or annual basis.
- 2) Participants are randomly drug tested 4-6 times per year. There are no daily call-ins. Test scheduling is controlled by SCRPP's random drug testing contractor, RecoveryTrek. Participants will be notified by RecoveryTrek when selected for testing; testing must be completed that same day. The cost of testing is the participant's responsibility. Participants must have two "chain of custody" forms in their possession at all times.
- 3) Senior participants are expected to periodically update, and remain in contact with, their assigned recovery specialist.
- 4) If you are a *voluntary participant* following successful completion of five years of documented, continuous sobriety\* (not subject to LLR Board order or associated with a mild diagnosis), the monitoring contract will be open-ended and may be terminated by the participant with a written request to SCRPP at any time. Participants subject to LLR Board Order must comply with the terms of the order. Participants with a mild diagnosis must participate for one year from the date of entry into the Program; full release is subject to Board approval.
- 5) Senior participants are expected to continue to mail, fax, or email meeting logs and required reports to their recovery specialist as set forth on the individualized requirements provided at enrollment.
- 6) Relapse and/or noncompliance by a Program participant will be treated as a new occurrence and a new monitoring agreement will be implemented. The participant will be referred for an evaluation and may be reported to the Board when necessary for public safety.
