RE: SC PMP Aware Reporting Options

As you may remember, the South Carolina Recovering Professional Program (RPP) asks prospective participants to complete a DHEC confidentiality release (DHEC release) and a DHEC Prescription Monitoring Consent form (DHEC consent) during the intake process. As staff and RPP policy changes, participants may be asked to execute an updated form.¹

The DHEC consent allows RPP's medical director (and her designees) to run a search through the South Carolina prescription monitoring program system known as SCRIPTS (South Carolina Reporting and Identification Prescription Tracking System). SCRIPTS allows RPP to confirm information concerning controlled substances that a participant has had filled within a specified time frame, as well as the prescriber who prescribed them and dispenser/pharmacy which filled them. The SCRIPTS system allows RPP to confirm a participant's controlled prescription history within South Carolina, across much of the Southeast, and in many other states across the United States. RPP's policy is to conduct a SCRIPTS search over the past four years at intake and generally twice a year while actively monitoring. A SCRIPTS search may be conducted on a more frequent basis for good cause shown.

The SCRIPTS search is conducted with a participant's express permission. Given the sensitive nature of this information, a participant must personally appear before Dr. Rebecca Payne, RPP's medical director, or a designee, so that the prospective participant's identity may be confirmed. If the intake process is not completed in person, the prospective or current participant may produce a copy of his/her driver's license to verify his/her identity. RPP requires a DHEC release so that RPP can deliver a copy of the signed copy of the DHEC consent to a DHEC designee. The DHEC designee maintains each form in a confidential file for the sole purpose of ensuring that RPP staff obtain permission before running a SCRIPTS report. RPP has received confirmation that this information is not used for any other purpose.

Prospective participants will also be asked to provide a pharmacy print out detailing all medications prescribed within the past twelve months. Collectively, this information is used to ensure a proper referral. Current participants are subject to the RPP abstinence policy and required to produce copies of their prescriptions to their assigned recovery specialist pursuant to RPP policy.
